

SYLVIA GRACZKA is an Economist and Environmental Engineer. She conducted studies at the Budapest Business School, the University of Bologna, the Corvinus University of Budapest and the University of Óbuda. She is currently a doctoral student in the Geopolitics and Sustainable Development Doctoral Program at the Corvinus University of Budapest.

For 15 years, her field of research has been sustainable consumption and production, with particular regard to policies aimed at resource-efficient, "zero waste" solutions within the circular economy and their monitoring.



She participated in the work of several domestic and international expert working groups and committees, including the National Environmental Protection Council, the Ecolabel Certification Committee, and currently, among others, in the OECD Working Party on Environmental Indicators group, or in the EIONET environmental protection expert network of the European Environmental Agency.

In 2018, she joined the Central Statistical Office, where she initially dealt with sustainable development indicators. As national focal point the domestic coordination of the UN SDG indicators is her responsibility. She is Head of Section of Environmental and Information Statistics since 2019, she is supervising data collections related to the state of the environment, the compilation of environmental accounts, public service data collections, digital statistics, and works on indicators of sustainable development. In addition, she regularly participates in research projects, she also took a role in the 'Mérők mérője' project.
