

FEDERICO PACHETTI is an Assistant Professor with the Department of Sociology and Social Policy, Corvinus University of Budapest. Previously, Federico held fellowships and teaching positions at Corvinus Institute of Advanced Studies (CIAS), New York University Shanghai (NYU Shanghai) and the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE).

He is interested in the history of the international political economy of the 20th century, with a focus on how international financial institutions and philanthropic Western non-governmental organizations



promoted the development of mixed economies in developing countries after 1945.

He has received several funding for his research from, among many, the University of Hong Kong, the Chinese Ministry of Education, the Society of Historians of America's Foreign Relations (SHAFR), the Scowcroft Institute of International Affairs, and the Rockefeller Archive Center in New York.

He received his PhD in global history from the University of Hong Kong. He has two masters, one in History of International Relations from LSE, one in International Relations and European Studies from the University of Florence. Federico completed his bachelor degree in Political Science and International Relations at the University of Pisa.
