Founded and directed Hungary's first university center of grants and innovation at Semmelweis University. Developed and initiated the first university courses on research and innovation management and R&D policy at Semmelweis University. Developed and initiated Hungary's first university-based course on Science Diplomacy at Corvinus University of Budapest, in the Faculty of Social Sciences and International Relations.



In 2014, he held the position of ministerial commissioner for Science Diplomacy in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Currently, he is a strategic consultant for both the national and international, for- and non-profit sector, and Privat Professor of Innovation and Science Diplomacy at Semmelweis and Corvinus Universities, Budapest, lecturing on the subject of strategic, project and innovation management, university-industry-government relations, regional development, competitiveness and EU R&D policy.
